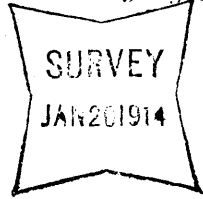

Sir:

I have the honor to transmit under separate covers

1 Sketch of shore line of Alaska Peninsula West of Chignik from
Chantliut Island to Pinusuk Island.

1 Record book of same.

Leaving Chignik on the morning of May 22, 1913, hugging the shore en route
to False Pass it was soon apparent that there were discrepancies in the shore line
as charted. From Chantliut Island a traverse was run by patent log and compass,
bow and beam bearings taken on prominent points being recorded and plotted as
shown.

The courses pass west of the small islands two or three miles west of
Mitrofanian Id. But Capt. McMullen, of the S.S. Dora, who passes over this country
frequently, lays a course from about our position at 8:10 A.M. to a point a quarter
of a mile west of the west tangent of Mitrofanian Island, passing over ground
indicated as dangerous on our charts.

Several sketches made of points as the vessel approached them are found
in the book. None were made of points after they were passed.
