

Survey on a scale of 10000of St Michael Water-front.

Due to the trouble that arose over the location of sites on the eastern shores of St. Michael Island, by the various Commercial Companies, I had made, for the Military Authorites there, a topographic and hydrographic survey, on a scale of one thousand, of the water-front extending from the narrow point, opposite Whale Island, to the first long point opposite the first island south of the North American Trading and Trans portation Co's. Post, and also a survey of the improvements on the cove opposite St. Michael. As it will be some time before the foregoing detailed work can be inked, platted and traced, all that will sensibly change Chart No. 9375 has been reduced and plotted, in red, on the copy to which this report pertains, so that the new edition may go to press without further delay. Topography:-

The topography on this chart is essentially correct. The large detailed work will not change it sensibly only in a few places. Hydrography:-

The Hydrography, as published on the chart, is too much generalized, the character along the shores, outside of high

The state of the s

water mark, (which is almost invariably r-ocky) is very faulty.

The Sub Sketch:-

This sketch has been quite severely criticised, the reason being that it is oriented different from the rest of the chart and has no compass rose for laying off courses. In two instances, hurriedly in the night, the compass on the large scale portion, for which there is seldom use, was taken to lay a course out to sea, from St. Michael Anchorage, with nearly disastrous results.

Inspection will show that there is no convenient means of laying of a course from this portion of the chart. It is hardly needless to state that the average navigators implements are dividers and a parallel rule.

Recommendation:

As all the shoreline from the northern portion of the Canal to Point Romanoff is eroneous "theoretical ge-ography",

I would recommend that this sub sketch be removed from this chart entirely and that a new separate chart be published,

about 28 X 39 inodes, on a scale of about 1/120 000, cove-ring from a little north of Egg Island to a little beyond the Aphoon Entrance and just taking in the hills and mountains plotted on the Hydrographic Sheet St. Michael to Aphoon Entrance, recently forwarded to the Office.


- For making St. Michael Bay, after Stuart Island is well sighted and for laying a course from St. Michael Anchorage, clear of Stuart Island when going to sea. The foregoing covers the route of all seagoing vessels entering and clearing St.

 Michael.
- For coasting to and fro between St. Michael and the Aphoon.

 Entrance, it being the route of all vessels plying on the Yukon.


