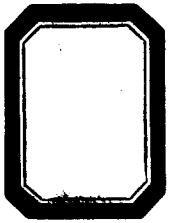

This sheet shows a re-survey of the 15 foot spot shown on Chart No. 134 off Taylor's Island about 3 miles south of James Point - upon which the U. S. Monitor "Terror" recently got aground.

The Δn . stations James Pt. Hills Pt. and Skid were recovered and the other signals shown on the sheet are temporary ones erected and determined with the plane table by Mr. S. Earle, D. O. Cl. 1 - on hydrographic projection No. 69 of Little Choptank River. No work has yet been done on this projection which at this date is still on board the schooner Eagle. The record of soundings are contained in those of the adjoining sheet Chesapeake Bay, Poplar Isd. to James Pt. 1902.
