I respectfully refer you to the memorandum (attached) made by Mr. H. L. Simons when plotting or attempting to plot Hydrographic Sheet No. 2660, surveyed by Assistant F. A. Young. The signals used are not indicated on the sheet. The positions of two hyd, signals cannot be located and the only certainty about those determined or rather selected by Mr. Simons appears to be that the positions can apparently be plotted in their relative positions by using them.

I suggest that Capt. F. A. Young be requested to indicate on the sheet, the signals used in the survey.

In protracting and plotting this work a great deal of the time has been spent in trying to locate the signals used. No notes are given to show which of the triangulation points were used and they have been renamed in such a way that it is impossible to tell which is which.

for "Duke" I have used White Ho. on point S.E. Chimney; for "Colt", Colton's Hotel. S.E.Chimney; for "Black", Blackistone Id. Lt. Ho. "Flag", "Light", "Staff", "Jane" and "Rod", I have not been able to locate and for this reason I could not plot the lines from 56-61d and 1-3d.

The lines 6-9d, 10-13d, 38-44d, 76-78d and 79-84d were not plotted. The records were not kept well.
