On lines 27 to 28h, 16 to 18l and 47 to 48h, the soundings were not plotted on account of weak angles and poor recording.

Attention is called to the manner in which time is recorded at positions where the course is changed. A second angle should be taken and a note made at these positions as it is next to impossible to locate the soundings correctly without something more definite is recorded.

No angle book or descriptive report covering this work has been received.

The soundings were reduced to mean Gulf level when received at the Office. These have been corrected to mean low water with reducers supplied by Tidal Division.
