

The resurvey shown on this sheet was made in pursuance of Paragraph 3 of Instructions dated June 25, 1909.

It had been reported to the Office that this shoal was shifting from its former position, but at the time of the resurvey, inhabitants of Province-town declared that no such change was taking place.

At any rate, the survey shows the extent and position of the shoal in the first week of September, 1909.

This shoal is merely a slight extension of the regular slope of the beach and but for the peculiar shape of the outer shore of Cape Cod would hardly receive special mention and an individual name.

It should not trouble any vessel giving the shore a proper berth.
