Sir:

I have the honor to acknowledge the receipt of your letteroff
Aug. 11th together with photo copies of section of Hydrographic sheet
No. 3564 and two pages of sounding record of Swanson harbor, Alaska.

After examination and replotting of the line, I can recall distinctly the time it was run, and that considerable current and choppy sea made progress very slow and showers of rain shut in signals that were necessary to make strong positions, therefore a weak set had to be used. The whaleboat sheet being wet and previous soundings being practically obliterated, I did not notice the discrepancy at the time.

It seems probable that the shoal soundings were within the area covered by wire drag and upon the same shoal. On account of the weakness of the positions, I would recommend that the line be rejected as the ship soundings west of the shoal develop that area sufficiently. I have replotted this line assuming a displacement of signal "dyke", 10 meters east of its position on the sheet

No descriptive report to accompany this steet. Swanson Harbor is an important anchorage, and further development of the approaches and additional lines in the main channel are desirable.

Sheet examined in Div. of Hyd'y & Top'y.

Hyd. Sheet No 3564 The line, which begins at pos. 28d (blue) and ends at pos 42d, has been rejected, at least temporarily, as it looks to be out of position. (by direction Chief of C. C. Div.) Vol (No. 1, is not a good record. Courses are seldom stated and changes of course were not entered. The practice of showing a small ink circle at each position, has long been discontinued.
