Preliminary Report on H. 4325

Verified and inked by H. E. MacEwen.

- 1. The records conform to the requirements of the General Instructions.
- 2. The plan and character of the development fulfill the requirements of the General Instructions.
- 3. Sounding line crossings are not adequate. Except in the case of a few shoal developments there are no cross lines run. In such cases the depths check satisfactorily.
- 4. The main depth curves can be completely drawn. Shoal curves (1, 2, 3, 5 and 10) can not be completely drawn for want of closer development inshore.
- 5. The field plotting was completed to the extent prescribed in the General Instructions. In all cases where the sounding record showed 4 feet, the field party plotted the 4 as the next whole fathom or: 21 fms. This does not comply with General Instructions. In many instances fractions were omitted in depths below 8 3/4 fathoms. Where fractions were plotted there were some indications of carelessness or lack of familiarity with instructions.
- 6. At this writing overlapping soundings from adjacent sheets have not been transferred.
- 7. Further surveying is not required to complete the area covered.
- 8. Remarks: The work on this sheet is excellent. The records are well kept and not lacking in any information necessary to an understanding of the operations. Explanations were complete and all necessary notes were included. The field plotting is open and legible and the field protracting excellent. It will be noted that lettering on signal names is rather heavy and put in without regard for the rule prohibiting the cluttering of water areas on Hydro. sheets with names, etc.
- 9. Character and scope of surveying excellent. Field drafting excellent.

- 1. The records conform to the requirements of the General Instructions, except that no descriptive report was submitted.
- 2. The plan and character of development conform to the requirements of the General Instructions.
- 3. The plan and extent of development satisfy the specific instructions.
- 4. The sounding line crossings are adequate.
- 5. The information is sufficient for drawing the usual depth curves.
- 6. The field plotting was completed to the extent prescribed in the General Instructions. Paragraphs 336 and 337 were not followed in converting fractions. In all depths greater than 9 fathoms 4 feet was plotted as the next greater fathom and in many instances of depths less than 9 fathoms fractions were omitted. The names of triangulation points were lettered without regard to interference with hydrography.
- 7. The character of the junctions with the adjoining sheets cannot be stated as the latter have not yet been plotted.
- 8. No further leadline surveying is required within the area of this sheet. The rocks and indications revealed by the survey show the need of dragging.
- 9. The character and scope of the surveying are excellent and the field drafting is good.
